#### SWOT ANALYSIS

Strength: The College has adequate resourceful teaching staff with Ph.D. Many faculties have their publications. Most of the faculty has guided research scholars. Institution is having thirteen (13) Honours subjects in Arts, Science and Commerce faculties. Some of the teachers are compiling books. The college has adequate sports facilities, enriched library, well equipped laboratory and a very healthy teaching environment in the campus. The institution is providing higher education to the most neglected stakeholders and ensuring women's empowerment by educating girls child.

Weakness: Latest teaching learning tools are yet to be fully implemented in the class room teaching. Lack of lucrative and advance infrastructural facility. Teachers are still paid in 4<sup>th</sup> pay commission due to financial crunch. Lack of guest lectures.

**Opportunity:** There is big opportunity for this institution having industries in the near periphery. An opportunity for better placement. Students have big opportunity to go for P.G and other professional courses after completing their graduation with Honours. Institution has introduced Vocational and skill based courses to enhance the practical knowledge with theory for ensuring better employability.

**Challenges:** GER ratio is a challenge for the institution and improving in GER by imparting education to the girls child and to the most downtrodden students of this locality. The institution has to conduct more and more national level seminars by attracting funds from UGC and other funding agencies. The institution is evaluated by external peers. To open distance education is another challenge. We have to publish one institutional journal by the help of resourceful teachers. To bring the students to the main stream of the society through proper education with more sociable attitude. To make the girl students more self reliant by providing them Marshall art teaching. To organise more and more enrichment courses and communicative English to do better in the interview.

#### **Best practices on seven Criteria:**

#### **CURRICULAR ASPECTS:**

University must allow the College to take their own decision and should support with financial aid and to give permission to design and develop skill based certificate courses to ensure more employment to compete with the present challenging job market. Feedback mechanism has also been initiated to bring new innovative changes in revised curriculum.

#### TEACHING - LEARNING AND EVALUATION:

To bring new and innovative teaching practices the institution must introduce MOOCS (MASSIVE On-Line open Courses) to shift from Black Board to the Key Board. To adopt hybrid teaching learning approaches mix face to face teaching practices. To introduce "Flipped Class Rooms" and to encourage plugging in to pre-recorded lectures, oral and visual aids. The teachers must have high level of motivation and willingness to work hard. Elevated levels of accepting intellectual challenges, efficient documentation habits, efficient time management.

#### RESEARCH, CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION:

University most give full support by giving incentives and should sanction funds for student and faculty research activity. All faculties should also take keen interest to apply to different funding agencies to attract funds for such research programme. The College has made a plan and provision of seed money for the teacher who interested in doing research. Research library are under plan to be establish department wise. All this activities will be governed by the research committee. The following measures have planned to give more wattage to the research.

- 1. Lectures by experts are creating awareness about the importance and need to undertake research.
- 2. Lectures are in the process on different aspects of research as an academic discipline.
- **3.** Lectures are planning to organize how to prepare more and more proposals for Minor and Major research projects of the UGC, as well as for other funding bodies as required by them in specific formats.
- 4. PhD holders are in the way to produce research scholars under them.
- 5. Planning to purchase more reference, Journals, competitive magazines, bio-graph, bibliography compilation, ethical and moral books for library.

- 6. Planning to invite more and more research scholars , scientists and experts from inside and outside the institution to address and groom the teaching, non-teaching staff and students. Similarly Institution and IQAC cell are planning to have a tie-up with industry, government departments, agricultural sector, IT sector and NGOs to start consultancy on the expertise areas. A separate Consultancy cell has been established under IQAC. The College is planning to have a tie-up with the following research institutions:
  - a. Central Institute of Medicinal and Aromatic research- Lucknow, Uttarpradesh
  - b. Indian institute of Chemical Biology- Kolkata
  - c. National Botanical Research Institute- Lucknow, Uttarpradesh

#### INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES:

The College is planning to computerise the library. Students will be issued bar-coded identity card which could be used in the library for registering students' foot-falls, for lending books and also for sending reminders in case of books are not returned within the stipulated time period. All the data of library could be available through College website. Institution is also planning to make the Manuscript and research journals to motivate the researchers. Inter library loan facilities are also under planning to add one more support to the user.

The Library is also planning to start a book bank in which needy students will be lent books as and when required. There is a library advisory committee consisting representative from faculty, students and staff. The librarian is the convener of the committee. Quarterly meetings are planned to organise with minutes. To look after the maintenance of the infrastructure there is a maintenance committee to take up the responsibility by outsourcing the work.

#### STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION:

One placement cell has been established under the guide lines of IOAC. Students who possess very good certificate from the head of the institution are advised to submit their resume /CV to participate in the campus interview or to apply to different private and public sector organizations under the supervision of Placement cell. IQAC is also planning to develop a student data base which will maintain all the record of each and every student participating in various activities during the college years. Inputs will be fed by the students under the supervision of their mentor. A separate cultural cell is under planning to identify students who would be interested in participating various co-curricular, extra- curricular and sports activities conducted on the campus and outside for taking care of the vital development of the students. Suitable training programme on academic aspects are also planning for the special identified students. IQAC is also planning to start MARSHALL ART programme for the girl's students for their self protection. An innovative practice include all the students and teachers irrespective of their age will participate in yoga and sports activities at least thrice in a weak for the development of the integral part of human development. There is a Grievance Redressal Cell for students and as per the Supreme Court guide lines two senior women faculty are in the charge of the committee. Alumni association is under planning for registration. Institution is also planning to invite alumnus to act as mentor of a small group of students and will help them to get exposure to the latest trends.

The Institution has received an amount of Rs 3,00,000/-from UGC to take quality initiatives in the 12<sup>th</sup> plan period. Teaching- learning tools and equipments has already been purchased through IQAC funds under the guidelines of IQAC Coordinator and the Principal. The major contribution of the IQAC is to establish a sense of Quality parameter among all stake holders by conducting seminars, workshops etc. Invite technical experts to train the teachers, non-teaching staff and students how to use latest teaching learning tools.

2.3.3 How is learning made more student-centric? Give details on the support structures and systems available for teachers to develop skills like interactive learning, collaborative learning and independent learning among the students?

Teacher of every department act as a mentor and allowed the students to take active part in the class room teaching and when the interactive session is going on in any related topic, ample scope is provided to the advance learners for group discussions and to use the wi-fi facility by downloading latest teaching methods and notes which develop skills like interactive learning and collaborative learning. For independent learning among the students, the student are allowed to go through the reference, text or journals by sitting in the reading room as per his/her requirement in a very cool and discipline atmosphere.

Students from the Science Stream are given opportunity to do project works, prepare PowerPoint presentations and task given to write essays, paragraph writings, art of letter writings and motivation done by the faculty members and provide them ample opportunities to take active part in university level student hunt programme and to participate in other extracurricular activities to give full exposure and motivate to go for the higher studies, for critical thinking they are allowed to do puzzle test, reasoning and for creativity and scientific temper among the students different certificate courses and skill development programme are being organised and conducted in regular intervals, organise science exhibition and to ensure transform them into life-long learners teachers motivate them to go for higher studies like P.G, BE.d, MBA, MCA and other professional courses not to give an end to the education.

2.3.5 What are the technologies and facilities available and used by the faculty for effective teaching? ICT is a part of the University Curriculum followed by the CBCS pattern. Technical expert from computer department has taken initiatives to provide opportunity for the interested students to down load (NPTEL) and (NME-ICT) and other (OER) materials to up-date themselves with the latest educational trends.

The Students and Faculties are exposed their advanced level of knowledge and skills by using LAN, Wi-Fi, What-sap, audio visual and through LCD Projectors as blended learning. Every department conduct seminars and workshops in different topics and invite experts to put forth their seminar proceedings .Students are given full opportunity to present their papers and allows to have a debate on the related issues.

Maximum number of students are benefited and guided by the mentors as and when required. Proper guidance is provided by the mentor to their mentees with homely affairs. A list/ records are maintained by each mentor to provide such benefits for the students with the support of IQAC.

When some teachers started and initiate such practice it found that the attendance of the student in the regular classes and in seminars are increasing and students are showing their interest to take active part through CD and pen drive to carry new and innovative notes to present. The students also show their interest by involving themselves with latest techniques which create an innovative practice on student learning. Faculty have also provided new innovative ideas to go through "MOOCs (Massive online Open Courses) which is a shining example of CBCS system.

Library has got 7926 titles with journals and magazines, which help its stakeholders to enhance the level of knowledge by utilizing the facility. The issue and return of books are doing through computers. Library is open in the time of examination and 2 hours in vacations for its end users. Lending library is also facilitated for the teachers and students to take maximum benefits. Computers, reprography, internet and printing facilities are also provided to all users to improve the teaching-learning process.

Once it short out by the industry expert communicated to the University through IQAC to implement such skill based courses to add in CBCS pattern.

  - § adequate infrastructure and human resources: Infrastructure facility are satisfactory. But to reduce the student teacher ratio institution has appointed temporary teachers and have signed institutional tie-up for faculty exchange programme to overcome the shortcomings.
  - §time-off, reduced teaching load, special leave etc. to teachers: When a particular teacher are engaged with any minor or major research work and are absent for a week or two then the subordinate teacher of the same department take the responsibility to complete the course. Special leave are allowed for such research activities and to attain seminars, evaluation work and workshops.
  - §support in terms of technology and information needs: Special training programme has been arranged by IQAC by which all the data are available in the finger tips as and when required by any teacher or administrator regarding the Quality related issues. Separate new technology has been adopted such as WI-FI, LAN, and internet are available for the need of the students, teachers and nonteaching staff.
  - § facilitate timely auditing and submission of utilization certificate to the funding authorities Internal audit has been completed till 2014-15 CA, UC has already been submitted to UGC for receiving grants in 11<sup>th</sup> plan.

### 7.3 Best Practices

#### **Best Practices number-1**

- 1. **Title of the Practice:** "Performance Enrichment Programme" (PEP) for students (Based on Teaching Learning and Evaluation)
- 2. **Goal:** The main goal of the practice is to improve the performance of the student at the entry level by providing different enrichment courses. To improve the performance of the learner. To run this practice, IQAC has selected the part-I students for the implementation on practice. IQAC was expected the Quality brand required by the employer.
- 3. The Context: A years back ago there was a tremendous curve in the admission graph as compare to the current session of admission. Day by day the curve is on negative aspects which are a challenge for all stake holders. Many alumni's occupy many top positions in the university examinations and in the job market as well. While student keep coming to our college as the demand is greater than supply. This kind of "also ran" reputation will not do if the college is really to be socially relevant. It was out of this sense of restlessness and after much debate the present practice (PEP) was evolved. However, let it be admitted that our real awakening came when we started working on our Self-Study Report (SSR) for the NAAC. There are Question in the SSR asked by the NAAC about the comparison of admission and examination result with the nearby institution. Then we started looking at ourselves more consciously and critically.
- 4. The Practice: As mentioned above, the practice was to be inclusive and to be introduced at the initial entry level, that is, the part-I students of the degree course. After all research and detailed study and brain stroming team members of IQAC found that there are three broadly marked categories of students in the class, namely the slow learners, the average learners and the advance learners. Our analysis further showed that the slow learners are basically those who find the course more difficult, as the gap between their previous course and the present one was a little wider than they could jump. Therefore, IQAC decided to introduce Bridge Courses. The second category of the average learners needed reinforcement efforts of practical nature. In other words, they understood the subject but lack the writing skill necessary for an effective presentation in the examination. For those group, IQAC start discussion lectures of selected difficult topics and also gave them intensive periodic writing assignments which we named "Sawal Jawab" (Hindi name) (literally a string of questions) or a series of questionnaires. These are basically home assignment but we ask them to complete them under examination conditions. After submission, we assess them carefully and give detailed feedback on case to case basis. That is, every mentor seat with each mentees and discuss the assessment and the performance and point out what is to be avoided and what is further needed. As for the advance learner group we devised a challenging programme. In addition to the writing assignment of the "Sawal Jawab" type we gave them reading lists for further investigation into the topics. This included articles in journals, popular print media, internet and books. The motivation of these students being very strong they willingly followed our instructions and showed high levels of involvements. IQAC was aware that this put a lot of additional burden on the workloads of the teachers involved in the practice. However, the commitment levels and the institutional team sprit are quite commendable in most of the team members. All of the team members could see the success of the students and the increased prestige of the College. IQAC also wish to

put on records that no teacher ever expected any extra remuneration for the work even if all the teachers are being paid as per the 4<sup>th</sup> pay commission.

5. Evidence of Success: IQAC have started the practice from the current session and the outcomes were quite satisfactory. A brief mention of the motives behind will be in place here. The annual result of this college at the university level was average 75 to 80%. Which was a big challenges for us as compare to the neighboring institutions. Our main challenge came from the fact that the students who joined our college were usually average and even below. We kept telling ourselves that with this quality of feeding the results as they stood were quite acceptable. However, the real eye opener came after we started the SSR preparation and found our challenges to overcome before we evaluate our college before the external "Peer Team" members. IQAC suggested several measures to enhance the performance of the students (and the teachers too!).

It is remarkable that the results were seen in the very first year as the average of 80% was crossed by almost to a prestigious curve as compare to the previous graph after introduction of CBCS pattern. This proved a great boost to the teachers, principal, the management and to all stake holders including parents expressed satisfaction over it and even felicitated the teachers involved in the practice. As a result our efforts were intensified and the students also were more involved. We are sure that the curve will be going upward hence forward.

6. **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** The main problem, in fact a challenge, was how to motivate the students to take part in the activity as absenteeism is a ubiquitous problem among the undergraduate and that to in the state of Jharkhand. The Principal, all staff, alumni, students held meetings under the banner of IQAC, convinced them how the programme was entirely for their benefits and how it would bring an image make-over also to their college. Slowly this counseling showed good results and the attendance became stable and grows.

Another very challenging issue was the correction of "Sawal Jawab" because it was not going to be a tick off job but a real, detailed, one-to one feedback, from spelling to the content. But we are all convinced that if an activity is worth doing, then it is worth doing to dedicatedly jump to the practice.

7. Notes: Going the extra mile first of all requires willingness to contribute the valuable time and efforts to a worthy cause. A will will find the way, as it is correctly said. Quality is everybody's concern and, in fact, a birthright of the stakeholders. Giving Quality to the students ultimately means putting good citizens in to the society followed by the Vision and Mission of the college.
